* NO SOCIAL SECURITY

For all the housework we have done ---because they say housework is not work! At best we get a partial check in our husband's name.

* LOW SOCIAL SECURITY

If we had a second job ---because women's wages are low and we took time off the payroll to care for our families.

* A PITTANCE FROM SSI

IF we make it to 65 ----which is doled out like a charity and doesn't even pay for both food and rent---much less for anything else.

THIS IS WHAT OUR "GOLDEN YEARS" ARE ALL ABOUT!

* NO SPACE OF OUR OWN: Rent is always too high for us and we are trapped in overcrowded, unsafe, rundown apartments where we have to fight the landlord not to freeze; or we are trapped in nursing homes welfare hotels or trailers: the old people's ghettoes. It takes money to go anyplace and how can we afford to take a trip or go out with friends on a budget of \$250 a month? At best, our social life is the senior center where we never meet people of other generations and where we even have to pay

for what we get with "volunteer" work.

* NO SOCIAL LIFE:

AT 65 OR 75 WE WOMEN KEEP ON WORKING.... UNTIL WE DIE

IN THE HOME: WE NEVER RETIRE FROM HOUSEWORK ---WE JUST TIRE!

If we have husbands now they are wageless too and even more dependent on our work. We have to stretch our last energies to keep the house going on a budget that has been drastically reduced and is eaten up daily by inflation. After raising our own families, now we often have to care for the grandchildren and help with the housework so that our daughters can go out "to work".

ON THE SECOND JOB: Often indispensable to make ends meet---now at the lowest wages ever, backed by the blackmail

that if we earn "too much" it will be deducted from our social security check!

AND VOLUNTEER WORK: Which we accept under the threat that they will cut even the few services now available to us. It's mostly older women who "voluntarily" staff the Senior Centers (after volunteering all our lives at home) and who visit the homebound so that they don't die of starvation or lonliness or both.




In spite of what they tell us,

AFTER A LIFETIME OF HARD WORK, WE STILL HAVE NOT "EARNED" THE RIGHT TO LIVE

Meanwhile, the government and business have grown huge and rich off our work because we raised all their workers for them. And they are still making money off the underpaid and volunteer work they "offer" us when we get older.

They even capitalize on our poverty and illness---witness the Nursing Home Scandal. THEY GIVE MONEY TO NURSING HOMES AND PROFITEERS OF ALL SORTS, BUT THEY DON'T GIVE IT TO US! WHEN WE DEMAND MONEY THEY SAY THEY



ARE POOR AND PLEAD "CRISIS". BUT WOMEN HAVE ALWAYS BEEN IN CRISIS AND NOW MORE THAN EVER. More and more of us are forced to beg and shop-lift to make ends meet and too many of us end up in mental hospitals or commit suicide because we <u>refuse</u> to cope with this kind of life.

BUT NOW WE ARE DETERMINED TO EVEN UP THE SCORE.

We are always told that we are too old or too young or not wise and worldly enough, and that we must care for others before we make a struggle for ourselves. But we have sacrificed too much of our lives to be fooled any longer. We know that if we don't fight for more, the little we have will be snatched away.


