#### STATEMENT

#### BY THE INTERNATIONAL FEMINIST COLLECTIVE FOR THE CAMPAIGN FOR WAGES FOR HOUSEWORK

On Wednesday October 29 across this country thousands of women working both in the home and outside the home will go on strike to demonstrate our power and our refusal of the work which has been imposed on all of us. On Friday October 24 the women of Iceland went on strike against the work they do in the home and outside the home and by that strike they were able to paralyze the entire country.

The International Feminist Collective for the Campaign for Wages for Housework not only supports these strikes but also supports and recognizes the continuous struggle millions of women all over the world carry on day after day against our common work and our common exploitation. It is clear in fact that the reason why women respond to the call by NOW and by the political parties of Iceland for a women's strike is not because NOW and the political parties of Iceland have ever recognized and expressed what our needs as women are. It is because we all women see in this day the possibility of making visible and unified the struggles we are continuously waging wherever we are and whatever we do. Precisely because the level of our struggle is so high we must be sure that these strikes are not just demonstrations of our strength but means TO INCREASE OUR POWER and TO GUARANTEE THAT

WE DON'T GO BACK HOME WITHOUT SOMETHING IN OUR HANDS. We don't want

just to demonstrate our strength but to use it and increase it to get what we want. It is precisely for this reason that all over the world more and more women are organizing around the Campaign for Wages for Housework. On March 8, 1974 women in Italy marched to demand wages for housework from the State and rallies to demand wages for housework spread in many countries of the world on May Day 1975.

we women spend most of our life working in the home and it is all work that we are not paid for. As the strike of women in Iceland demonstrated, without our work nobody could go out to work. Factories, offices, schools, hospitals, restaurants, telephones ... they would be all shut down, and the economy would come to a halt.

Yet this work is not even considered as work. We get

no vacations, on holidays we work twice as much, we are expected to service everybody and put our needs last.

We sweat our life away while business and the government have grown rich through our work. Business and Government profit from our work THEY SHOULD PAY FOR IT

The fact that we are not paid for the work we do in the home is our common exploitation and the ground of our weakness in every situation. But increasingly we are saying NO.

#### NO MORE WORK FOR FREE

We are tired of having to depend on a man or on welfare for our survival. We are tired of the second job that leaves us no time of our own. We are tired of not being able to have the children we want and have to pay such a high price of work and misery for those we bear. We are tired of our work and of not having any time of our own.

# WE ARE NEVER UNEMPLOYED BUT SIMPLY UNPAID WE NEVER RETIRE BUT JUST TIRE WE ALL WANT MORE MONE AND LESS WORK

The NOW perspective and objective on the women's strike day completely fail to understand that this is what we women want. NOW for example is asking us not to spend money on our strike day. To that we say that our real problem is that we have never had enough money to spend. Shopping is work and it is even harder when we don't have enough money. This is our crisis and our struggle is not to increase our level of poverty and deprivation, to increase our work and gain equal exploitation but to destroy our work and take back the wealth we have created.
