If you are arriving before Friday 18th, please if possible tell us the date and time in advance. You can phone 778 2782 when you arrive.


If you are arriving on Friday before 6.30pm, phone 452 1338, or if you speak only German phone 624 1437 (we hope to have someone there who can speak some German.) We will be waiting to meet you at 67 Brondesbury Villas, London NV6, which is in Kilburn near the school. If you are arriving by air, go by coach to Victoria Terminal, and then walk to Victoria Railway Station, where you can get a number 16 bus to Brondesbury Villas, or the underground ("tube") to Kilburn Park. (If you take the underground you need the Queens Park branch of the Bakerloo Line.—the brown line on the underground map. The underground is more complicated than the bus, but faster in the rush hour and on Saturday, when the bus is very slow. To get to the Bakerloo line take the Victoria line to Oxford Circus and change trains there.

If you are arriving on Saturday, or after 6.30 on Friday, at Heathrow airport, the fastest way to get to the school is to go by coach to We st London air terminal at Cromwell Rd., and ask directions to a 28 or 31 bus.

If you are arriving by train, or by air to <u>Gatwick</u> airport, you can go straight to Victoria Station and follow the directions above.

We hope to find places for everyone to sleep without paying. Please bring a sleeping bag, and please let us know as soon as possible how many will be coming from your country. This is very important. For those who have to pay the cost will be shared.

The major costs of the conference will be a) the hall; b) if women are able to come from Northern Ireland and Portugal we will pay their fares (otherwise on one will be able to attend from these countries). Since we will not ourselves be travelling the POW Collective will make the major contribution to these costs, but we will not be able to meet them alone. To avoid heavy collections from those attending, groups may want to contribute collectively towards making the international conference possible.//We have just heard that 20-30 women will probably be attending from Italy. They will bring a videotape of their big May 1st wages for housework demo. They have requested that we extend the conference to continue on Monday. Please let us know if you will



It will be a great help to the conference if groups can bring written reports (160 copies or more if possible) of developments in women's situation and struggles in their countries, and of their own work, problems, experience.
