



I am delighted that you will participate in the IXth International Congress of Anthropological and Ethnological Sciences, which will be held at the Conrad Rilton Hotel, Chicago, Ill., August 28-September 8, 1973. Research sessions (pre-Congress conferences) will be held August 28-31, and the general sessions will be held September 1-3. The date for our session, "Cross-Cultural Perspectives on the Women's Movement and/or the Status of Women," has not yet been set.

Would you please send, at the earliest possible time, a 200-word abstract of your paper, both to Dr. Sol Tax at the Congress a Office and to me? The paper itself should follow as soon thereafter as possible.

The papers will be included in a book which will be one of a series on WORLD ANTHROPOLOGY, which will become a standard reference series belonging to be Congress, designed to use the occasions of future Congresses to keep abreast of anthropology. Parts of this series, including individual papers and groups of papers, will be available for quick and inexpensive "secondary" publications for college and other uses. Royalties on such profitable uses could be paid to editors and authore.

The abstracts of the papers will be compiled into a book which will be sent to all authors. Since the papers will not be read aloud during the Congress, but distributed in advance, any paper can serve several sessions to which it is relevant.

During the pre-Contress conferences, August 28-31, the authors of the papers will organize the discussion of the session of the Congress which is allocated to them. This is probably the most important part of the Congress, and should be attended by authors who can spend only a limited amount of time at the Congress. Authors who cannot attend the Congress in person can still submit papers.

Advance copies of all papers in our session will be sent to each author for study before the Congress, together with my summary, so that authors may write comment on the issues suggested as agenda for discussion during the Congress session.

Would you please fill out the enclosed registration card and Reply Form, and return them to the Congress office as soon as possible? A personal invitation to the Congress is also enclosed. Happy writing!
