The pre-Congress Conference will be held August 28-31, at the Pioneer Inn, Oshkosh, Wis., where rates are \$52.00 a day, full American plan, double occupancy. I enclose registration form.

Less expensive accommodations can be obtained at the University of Wisconsin dorms \$\inc \text{56.00} for a single and \$5.00 per person for a double room, with inexpensive meals available on the campus. Also, for Eng. \$\inc \text{speaking}\$ foreign visitors, various faculty members and friends of the University have offered their homes and hospitality. In Chicago, you can stay at the Conrad Hilton, for about \$17.00 per person double occupancy, per day.
