It contains the songs and speeches we made at the Rally, as well as leaflets from the demonstrations for wages for housework held internationally on the same weekend.

We are very excited by it, because at the same time as it marks our opening shot in the International Campaign for wages for housework, it is also the first mass wages for housework pamphlet we have. The speeches were made by eight different women, talking about their situations of full-time housewife, waitress, student, lesbian, welfare mother etc., and all saying the same thing -- we all need wages for housework. As such the pamphlet appeals to the widest variety of women, and we hope you will find it useful in your organizing work.

This time we printed a large quantity, so there will be enough for everybody (not like the Women in Struggle series which ran out and is in the slow process of being reprinted in a much nicer format).
