Also, Harriet Lutzky ^(from Paris) may be willing to get the money from Git de Coeur for Sylvine. I'll try to arrange it. She was here last week + I could have arranged everything if the parcel had been in my hands in time!

The pamphlet looks beautiful, but it's so expensive! Who will afford it? I hope soon to see a translation - now there are others besides Silvia + Joan Hall to do this work - at least one other.

I am to be away for a week of
quiet & then two weeks in Bristol
of semi-quiet. The doctor insists &
I heed it. But finally the wages for
housework per spective has gone home -
The response in N. America has been
tremendous. And it is clear that
groups of working class women are
already demanding the wage per se
which we are uncovering. Once
it takes hold there, in a year or
two it will be a mass movement.
This is no dream but an estimate of
power.

Your photos look magnificent &
show that you have accumulated
a lot of power there. The women here
will be delighted & feel stronger. Many
changes are taking place here, all for
the better. I will write when there
is both time & energy.
