Other women involved in the co-ordinating committee have various backgrounds -some more or less militant Than others. Some women have

been in MLF groups others have not due 140.0 posto blems with French or general "fear" of meetancy. We hope to attract a wide variety of women to the "Celebration". the foreign population in beneve is over 60%. We have contacts with employee groups (primarily secretaries) in UN, ILO, WHO, CERN and we want those women at the Celebration. So for the MLF has not reached avery large number t these women. I emphasize a spectrum because we hope that women at the very early stages of awareness well come as well as committed feminists. about the movie, 9 didn't mean there was a movie "wages for housework" but rather we will have movies about work x work campaigns.

Dear Sisters,

We are a collective of women involved in the women's liberation movement and in international documentation. We have continually experienced the need for communication and information in the women's movement: from our consciousness raising groups to political actions on the local, national and international levels. Because of our concern about this need, we have pooled our resources and experience and have created ISIS - a counterinformation and communication service for all women involved in the struggles for our liberation.

By counterinformation we mean the materials that we are producing in our local groups wherever we are - songs, newsletters, bulletins, videotapes, films, posters, magazines, books, journals, photographs, poetry, art work, human resources -- information which is not readily available through the established communication channels, or widely available outside local situations. The information we collect and receive is cross-indexed and stored in our information system called OASIS (the enclosed Project Description tells how this works). This will provide a rich resource file on any topic of concern to the women's movement. Based on this, ISIS is ready to respond to the information needs of any women or women's groups around the world, to provide information for study, research, projects or actions. Already we are getting regular calls and letters.

ISIS is also a <u>channel of communication</u> for the local, national and international feminist movement - an international network of contacts and exchange. It is not, however, in any way intended to centralize or organize activities of the women's movement. ISIS will help to put existing groups, women and actions in contact with each other, to mobilize support and solidarity for women wherever and whenever they are confronted with oppression and discrimination. For example, a group of Lisbon women were attacked in January by thousands of

men during a feminist demonstration: ISIS could have called on its rapidly expanding number of contacts to help publicize this and mobilize support for the Portuguese women. For us, international communication is powerful and crucial.

To help carry out these tasks, we will produce a <u>monthly bulletin</u> containing:-

- counterinformation (reproduction of documentation)
- listings of the kinds of resources ISIS has available
- news of events and projects coming out of the feminist movement and women's groups in Africa, Asia, Australasia, Furope, Latin America and North America.

Since the raison d'être of ISIS is to share activities, information and creations among women and women's groups, we invite you to send us:-

- DOCUMENTATION newsletters, bulletins, magazines, plays, poems, journals, bibliographies, photographs, posters, films, videotapes, tapes, women's art (or information about these and where they can be found), produced by women in their involvement in the political process of liberation.
  - CONTACTS names and addresses of other groups and women you feel ISIS should be in contact with and who can use ISIS. We ask you to pass this letter on to other people too.
  - NFWS about your actions, about conferences, meetings, demonstrations, coming events on the local, national and international levels.
  - EXCHANGE SUBSCRIPTIONS with us those of you who are regularly producing magazines and newsletters, etc. Our monthly bulletin will appear regularly in January 1976, but we will produce several numbers in 1975. We would like to receive your publications now.
  - CONTRIBUTIONS ideas for raising money, and your own financial support if you can afford anything. These can be sent to either: Post Office Account No. 12-22772 GFNEVA, in the name of "Service féminin international d'information et de communication ISIS" (within Europe money can be sent through any post office), or: ISIS, Wachovia Bank and Trust Co., Winston-Salem, North Carolina 27102, USA.
  - SUGGESTIONS your ideas about ISIS, what issues you are involved in and how ISIS can be useful to you.

We hope you will call on the resources of ISIS at any time. During the next few months the ISIS collective can be contacted in Geneva, Rome or the United States at the addresses below.
