I am afraid that it would not work out with your sister because there is no one here who speaks Italian well enough to act as a translator.

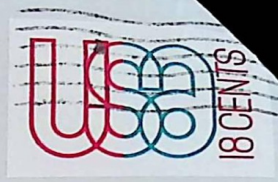
We plan to have the program again next summer and perhaps it would be possible for you to come next year.

Dear Ms. DellaCosta,

I have read your articles which had been translated into English with much interest. I am putting together a summer program of Women's Studies at Coddard College in Plainfield, Vermont, and would be very happy if you would consider joining us for the month of July.

We hope to draw working women, housewives, teachers, and college students. The program is of twelve week duration, June - August; During July we plan to focus on international perspectives and have invited faculty from other countries: Sheila Rowbotham from England, Fatima Mermissi from Morocco, Francoise Feldman from France, and yourself, among others.

We would hope to have seminars and workshops centered around your ideas, a group of readings which you might suggest to the students, and interaction among the faculty; the particular content and structure of your participation is flexible. We will also offer courses in education, sociology, and literature; our needs are greatest in the area of political theory, and of social reform.

Students will live together in the college dormitory and academic credit is available. The exact dates of the July session are July 9th through July 30th. The college will provide room and board to the faculty, and we can offer you five hundred dollars towards traveling expenses and a salary of two hundred dollars per week.

The existence of the program depends on whether we can find women interested in enrolling in our program. We should know about that definitely by the end of March. I would appreciate it if you could let me know right away if it might be possible for you to come. Even if you can't make a definite commitment right away, could you also send me a note about yourself, which we can use to show prospective students, and a paragraph about the content of what you might like to teach or discuss in July. Later we can communicate about the specifics of the program, and I will also forward you a more detailed outline of the whole summer.
